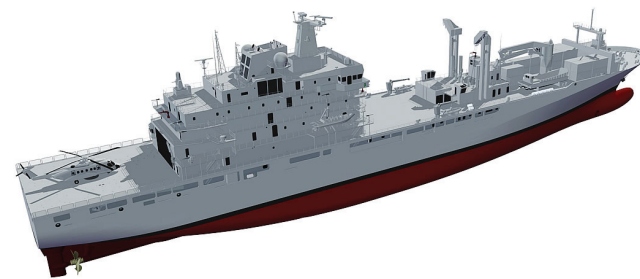

Number of ships in Canada's Navy at the end of the Second World War in 1945:

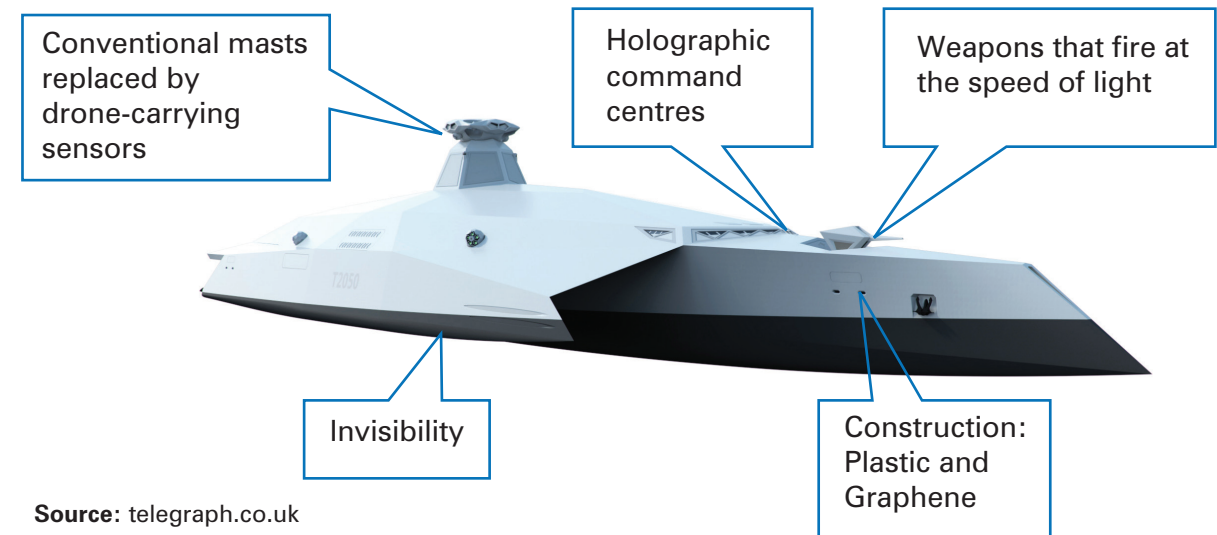


Number of ships in Canada's Navy in 2015:



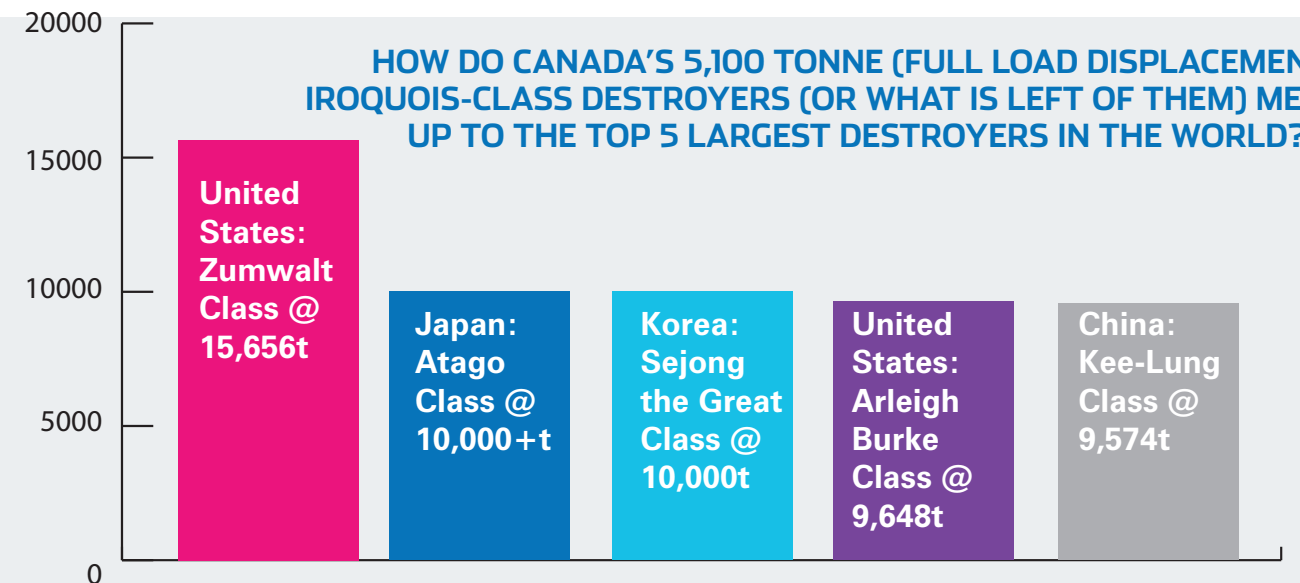
